In a letter dated February 14, 2011, I advised Dalhousie University that, pursuant to subsection 4(1) of the *Post-Secondary Education Choice and Excellence Act, 2000*, it was my intent to grant consent to Dalhousie University to advertise and offer in Ontario a Master of Business Administration (Financial Services) program, and to hold itself out as a university in relation to activities authorized by this consent and be known in Ontario by the name of Dalhousie University.

The intent to grant consent was subject to Dalhousie University accepting the terms and conditions set out in the letter of intent which included the Standard Terms and Conditions for a public institution.


