5. Admissions, Promotion, Graduation Standard

5.1 Direct Entry Admission

5.1.1 Admission Requirements Direct Entry

Humber would like to make a slight modification to the approved academic admission requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Arts (Interior Design) degree.

Currently, the academic admission requirements state:

Ontario Secondary School Students must have a minimum of six 12U or M courses in the new curriculum or six Ontario Academic Courses (OAC) in the old curriculum, including 12U English or OAC English 1 with a minimum average of 65% and any 12U Mathematics or OAC math with a minimum average of 60%. Students must have a minimum overall average of 65%.

The College would like to change the math requirement to permit students to have either a Grade 11 or 12 U or M mathematics course. All other requirements would remain the same. The revised program admission requirements would be as follows:

Academic	<p>Ontario Secondary School Students must have a minimum of six 12U or M courses in the new curriculum or six Ontario Academic courses (OAC) in the old curriculum, including 12U English (or OAC English 1) with a minimum average of 65% and a 12U or M Mathematics course (or Grade 12 or OAC math in the old curriculum) with a minimum average of 60%. Students must have a minimum overall average of 65%.</p> <p>Alternatively, Ontario Secondary School Students who lack a Grade 12U math may apply to the program if they have a minimum of six 12U or M courses in the new curriculum or six Ontario Academic courses (OAC) in the old curriculum, including 12U English (or OAC English 1) with a minimum average of 65%, plus a Grade 11 U or M Mathematics course with a minimum average of 60%. Students must have a minimum overall average of 65%.</p>

While students require some math to be successful, they do not require the level of math skills developed through a Grade 12U mathematics course. This modification is consistent with the math entry requirement for the Bachelor of Interior Design offered by Ryerson University.
