**Re: Application from Humber College Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning for Ministerial consent to continue to offer a Bachelor of Applied Technology (Industrial Design) program:
Recommendation to Grant Consent**

Pursuant to section 5(1) of the *Post-secondary Education Choice and Excellence Act, 2000*, on June 20th, 2007, Humber College Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning applied to the Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities for consent to continue to offer a Bachelor of Applied Technology (Industrial Design) program, the current consent for which is due to expire on August 7, 2008, and the first cohort for which completed the program on April 20, 2007.

In accordance with section 5.2 of the *Act*, the application was referred on July 12th, 2007, to the Board for its review and recommendation. The Board reviewed the application in accordance with its *Handbook for CAAT Renewals, May, 2006*, and gave final consideration to the application at its meeting of February 25th, 2008.

Based on:

- the applicant's original submission,
- any additional material submitted by the applicant, and
- the Board's assessment of the information against the Board's standards and benchmarks for a bachelor degree in an applied area of study,

the Postsecondary Education Quality Assessment Board recommends that you **grant consent** to Humber College Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning to offer a Bachelor of Applied Technology (Industrial Design), to be abbreviated B.A.T., at its 205 Humber College Boulevard campus, until April 20, 2010. This consent termination date

is recommended since it is the earliest convenient time that the Board will be able to conduct a full review of the program after there has been at least one graduating class and the institution has been able to conduct and operationalize the results of its mandatory self-study.
