Dear Dr. Rose:

In a letter dated August 9, 2010, I advised Niagara University that pursuant to subsection 4(1) of the *Post-secondary Education Choice and Excellence Act, 2000*, it was my intent to renew the consent to Niagara University to advertise and offer a Master of Science in Education (Educational Leadership) program in Ontario and to hold itself out as a university in relation to activities authorized by this consent and be known in Ontario by the name of Niagara University.

The intent to renew the consent was subject to Niagara University accepting the terms and conditions set out in the letter of intent which included the Standard Terms and Conditions for a private institution, and the following additional condition of consent:

- In public materials that refer to the program offered in Ontario (including but not limited to recruitment and advertising materials and the university's calendar and website), Niagara University will:
  - a. refer to the program either as a Master of Science in Education or MSE; and
  - b. not refer to the program as a Master of Science or MSc.

My letter also indicated that the consent would be for a period of five years, commencing from the date of my written confirmation that Niagara University had satisfied the requirements for consent. I would like to confirm that I have received and am satisfied with the signed Applicant Agreement Form and the requirements for consent as noted in the August 9, 2010 letter.


